To say that I saw this pandemic coming would be a lie. When we suspended in person services in mid-March, I was pretty confident that we'd be back by Easter...and then definitely by the end of May...and then, surely, we'd be back in June!

The truth is, I've given up trying to set a date on our return to some version of in-person worship and on when our worship might begin to look "normal" again. The estimates are all over the map and can vary so wildly depending on all kinds of factors. This virus doesn't care

what our plans are. It's only job is to spread and it will continue to do that every time it is given the opportunity.

I know you're probably disappointed. I am, too. But the best we can do right now is just that—our best. And our best does not mean taking unnecessary risks or bending over backwards and making herculean efforts to create something that doesn't feel right. Our best means looking out for one another, weighing our options, and choosing the one that makes the most sense. This is why Council has decided to continue suspending in person worship in Yellow. Not because the Synod has forced us to (they can't), but because when we really sat down and thought about it, we felt the most faithful option for all involved was to continue offering worship online and by conference call.

I don't know when we'll be in person together again, but I hope it is sooner rather than later, when we can be more confident that all are safe. In my ordination, I was charged to "Witness faithfully in word and deed to all people." I believe that's what I am doing now, in partnership with our Council. We are asserting that the well-being of our members and of our larger community are of the most importance. We will continue to be church together in these new ways until we feel confident we can be church together, safely, in person.

Through all of this, we rely on God. We rely on God to speak to us through the Holy Spirit and guide our decisions. I pray for you all and am ready to rejoice when we are gathered together again!






